"The elderly population in Chelmsford is expected to increase from 32,700 in 2015 to 40,100 in 2025 with the number of people living with dementia by 2030 expected to rise by 66%"

- Download your Skills Transcript which can help you prepare your CV and for future job interviews.

How much time will I have to commit?

It is recommended that you attend one committee meeting per month during normal term time.

Please note that this role is flexible and can be adapted to fit around your academic studies, other commitments, specific skills and needs. This role can also to split between one or more other volunteers if required.

Does the role come with support and training?

- You will receive a full induction to ensure you are confident in delivering your role to your best ability.
- You will have access to Skills Workshops delivered by ARU Students' Union or Anglia Ruskin University.
- Supervision and support from our Chelmsford Volunteer Coordinator.
- You can claim out of pocket expenses, as outlined in our Volunteer Handbook.
