Debbie has made enquiries with Money Advice service with regards to whether students nurse would be better off or not with student loans. Received the following:

They will be somewhat better off: in 2016/17 a single student not studying midwifery (which has additional extra weeks) whose household income is below £25k will be entitled to £7,059 bursary compared with a maintenance loan of £8,200. On the downside, they will end up with more debt and will no longer be paid monthly but they should become eligible for university bursaries and scholarships. We also think that students who are married/cohabiting and who have dependent children may lose out on dependents' allowances but we do not have detail as yet.
