#### 5. 5.1 Ideas

MB presented a possible revamp to the 'Ideas' process to improve accessibility and usefulness. Highlights:

- Existing process is overly administrative and will be streamlined.
- Emphasis will be on students being proactive and able to act quickly to gather support for their idea.
- Increase in time and number of 'likes' to support an idea 50 votes in 3 weeks with an overall positive balance will be brought to Executive Committee. Feedback will be given to the student.
- Executive committee would have oversight to reject ideas which are already in place / an existing, or need a new campaign / do not meet our values / are offensive / require further consultation / are a quick win and will be actioned.

NC: This seems less complicated than previous incarnations. Promo will be needed with a relaunch.

ACW: Overall this seems effective.

LD sought clarity around 50 'likes'

MB: this is a quoracy of the vote and the outcome must be positive to proceed.



#### 6. 6.1 Exec Awayday

MB: This will be postponed due to lack of availability until March. Content will include next steps, ongoing campaigns and future thinking.

Dates will be set online via the Exec group. Input or suggestions welcomed.

#### 7. 7.1 NUS National Conference

LD: Summarised the purpose of National Conference and requested that the Executive Committee support policy proposals from ARU Students' Union.

#### 7.2

LD: A policy proposal could be submitted to extend the call for the nursing bursary to include all medical service students.

The Executive committee agreed.

#### 7.3

LD: A policy proposal could be submitted to request improvements to counselling services to support students on placement who struggle to access this type of service.

TL: Placement students are able to access services via skype and with variable session times to support those in placement.

LD: Should we still submit on behalf of the wider student movement, outside ARU?

MC: Would this include academic support such as study skills+?

LD: No, but we could submit an additional motion; this would need to go to another 'zone'.

MC: There is evidence for problems with accessing this service at ARU and could be beneficial.

LD: will explore options for policy on this.

#### 7.4

LD: ARU are one of the biggest providers of degree apprenticeships. We are concerned about the rights of degree apprenticeship students in the event of e.g.: business collapse or staff dismissal and in relation to University provisions of e.g.: wellbeing services. LD would like to develop a policy on this. Executive committee agreed.

### 8. 8. Policy

#### 8.1 Meaningful Mental Health Campaigns.

LD: No animals have been brought onto campus by the SU.

MH noted that society requests have been put forward but these would not be permitted.

KT expressed that she did agree with this policy. The popularity of activities including animals has been noted at the Group Chat, and through sign ups to previous events.

TL added that therapy animals are an accepted and effective therapy within the medical community.

LD noted that this policy is active until April as it was voted by Council last year.



MB noted that the policy will expire in April and any resubmission can be discussed then.

LD: Against the Marketization of HE; we have met with NUS representatives to discuss and support this.

LD: We have been working with Andrea Cheshire (head of student services) to encourage further BME recruitment, although additional funding is lacking for specific roles.

ACW: we have been inputting into the wellbeing strategy and decision making on this provision.

#### 8.2 Liberate the Curriculum

LD met with Library staff to increase relevant subject specific books with higher LGBT and BME content.

LD also met with Alletta Norval to put university policy regarding this issue in place.

LD: has been working on the BME attainment gap project with RG through The Student Engagement Partnership.

#### 8.3 Against Cuts to Education

LD: We have not undertaken much action on this. There is a UCU ballot for strike action and an article has been produced for our website to explain this to students. The ballot will be closed soon and we will need to decide a stance if strike action occurs. MB: add to the agenda for next meeting

#### 8.4 Against cuts to the NHS

LD: Policy will be taken to NUS national Conference.

TL: The policy notes that funding is not available for paramedics and other non-nursing students travelling to placement (union believes 9.). This is incorrect.

LD: This section of the policy is what the union 'believed' and may include historical inaccuracy. This should be addressed if the policy is resubmitted. The available funding may not be available for all students on placement.

MC has been working with the advice team to support and inform students about learning support fund to support students who have lost grants etc. (this sits within against cuts to education)

# 9. Secutive Officer Updates:

#### 9.1 Mary Copsey (VP Business and Law)

- 9.1.1 Part Time jobs Fair is complete and has received positive feedback from employers and the Group Chat.
- 9.1.2. Carers awareness has included collaboration with the activities team and give it a go sessions including self-care and tea parties.



Dementia Friend training is coming up.

Parent and Carers society has launched

Childcare support and breastfeeding facilities are planned.

Information about available support such as reasonable adjustments is planned.

- 9.1.3 Business blogs are ongoing and promotion is ongoing.
- 9.1.4 Rent campaign: working with FLY on 'find a flatmate' events in February.

  International housing guide is in development and feedback has been given by international office.
- 9.1.5 International support campaign: Student consultation has been undertaken to establish levels of knowledge about the support available. Promotion of available support is ongoing through newsletters and building links between SU and international students.

ACW: Is the information available in one place?

MC: Ideally information will be held in one place although SU and Uni provision will still remain separate. The 'package' is not a literal package but includes academic support and assessment offences video carried out in semester 1. There will also be a focus on inclusion in SU events that are not uniquely marketed to international students such as Global Week. A tile on Canvas would help but IT provision is slower than hoped.

MH: have you met with activities re: international inclusion in Global Week?

MC: Yes I have had meetings with the team and sit on the Global Week and other relevant working groups and have also secured funding support from the university. Please let us know other events that are during global week to include them in the discussions.

LD: Have you spoken to International Office about external promoter events; an international night may be upcoming?

MC: I have already met with TM but can raise this with International Office to share with students

LD: I will pass on some relevant research to you

#### 9.2 Laura Douds (President)

- 9.2.1. Rent campaign: Currently reviewing survey results (just under 500 respondents). I have met with Daniel Zeichener MP and he will take the report forward when it is completed. We also met with Vicky Ford MP to seek support although this in uncertain.
- 9.2.2 LGBT History months are set up and should be in calendars (LD to check/ forward invitations)

9.2.3. Christmas Companionship: 6 students came to the event including a parent with their child, trans students and international students. Costs were low and the impact for this cost was worthwhile.

#### 9.2.4 VC recruitment

LD and MH met with Anglia Ruskin University Vice Chancellor candidates and have provided feedback. SU involvement has been valuable and was not automatically included in the process.

#### 9.2.5 ARU SU CEO recruitment

Organising aspects of this process has been time consuming.

MT received some very positive feedback from students who attended the Christmas Companionship event.

#### 9.3 Fraser Luther-Yarwood

#### 9.3.1 Peer Mentoring

The money allocated for this project is now returned to the SU budget as the university will be funding the project as 'welcome buddies' and recruitment will be starting soon.

- 9.3.2 #Love Societies will be relaunching soon and the Society of the March award will launch in February.
- 9.3.3 Working with MC on the Find a Flatmate events in February; 18<sup>th</sup> (Cambridge) and 12<sup>th</sup> (Chelmsford)
- 9.3.4 Park and Ride: With support from environment team seeking to get a student discount for Chelmsford and Cambridge. An app for car-pooling is available and will be promoted.
- 9.3.5 Library changes and reduced fees will be launched soon and an article will be provided online.
- 9.3.6 Hot food in Young Street: A meeting is planned for 14th February to bring microwave and kettle to Young Street. FLY hopes to bring the Peterborough model to Young Street This was established in December and new vending machines and a hot food selection has been provided!
- 9.3.7 Part time students who work on placements have varied rules on council tax support and we will collaborate with the university to produce a statement and support for students who are able to claim a rebate
- 9.3.8 SSLC feedback supports a 24hr opening for the medical school and this will be raised with security (with faculty support). Discussions are ongoing



9.3.9 SSLC accessibility will be supported by the trialling of Big Blue Button technology which allows for online participation.

ACW: How will this be promoted to students?

FLY: Invites will include this option.

TL: This technology can include video or audio only options.

9.3.10 FLY has been meeting with faculty and volunteering team to increase volunteering for education courses as they do not have placements.

#### 9.4 Matt Hayes (VP Science and Engineering)

9.4.1 There has been no further progress on the drug harm reduction policy.

#### 9.5 Amanda Campbell-White (VP Arts Humanities and Social Sciences)

- 9.5.4 De-stress fest planning has been taking place with several departments across the university. Executive Committee are encouraged to lead activities or be involved.
- 9.5.5 Community project; working with MC and taking donations to local charities. This has been very well received and will be repeated.
- 9.5.6 All AHSS Course Reps will be visible on course canvas home pages this has taken some time and is a big win.
- 9.5.7 SSLCs now include activities and SU events as an agenda item.

#### 10.1 Niamh Cubitt: LGBT+ Students' Rep (Cambridge)

Pronoun Badge Campaign: The badges have arrived ready for LGBT history month and a page on the website will be developed. This will include a link to provide feedback on the badges (they are currently a trial).

- 11.2.1 The Young Street survey received 73 responses. Highlights showed an ongoing need for a kettle and microwave and a meeting is arranged with faculty staff to resolves this. Also working to establish social space in Young Street
- 11.2.2. Interview and testing days are often quiet and students do not engage verbally TL will develop a video to support new students.
- 11.2.3 Trying to arrange speakers for International nursing day in March.

#### 11.3 Ben Morris: HEMS Faculty Rep (Chelmsford)

- 11.3.1. Working on paramedic care package campaign. Collaborating with UEA SU and hosting a vision visit. Supporting LD to take a motion to NUS Conference.
- 11.3.2 Trying to arrange a meeting with placement teams to resolve some placement concerns.
- 11.3.3 Meeting with lecturers who are based in offices which students cannot access has been raised as a concern. BM met with Matt Webster to consider options.


