#### 2. ltems for Discussion

2.1. Bye Law Change – Faculty & Campaign Rep Election Period

The Committee received a paper proposing that Faculty Reps and Campaign Reps move to be elected in line with the October rep election, meaning that the Spring election will only be for the Executive Officers.

Pros and Cons were given for, and members were asked for any questions.

No questions were asked, and the proposal was passed with 13 votes cast (12 in room and 1 via email) and 13 approvals

#### 2.2 Student Trustee recruitment

The committee received a paper following the interview for a student trustee. Having read through the document and the response of the interview panel the committee approved the recruitment with 13 votes cast (12 in room and 1 via email) and 13 approvals.

#### 3. **3.** Faculty Rep Updates:

3.1. LB – It has been quite a busy month so has not been able to make as much progress but is looking to at starting to plan a Faculty Forum for HEMS course reps this semester as well as planning a HEMS Ball

FLY – A meeting took place between FLY, LB & SJ so while the faculty forum will be planned there will be a live survey over the winter break for HEMS students to provide feedback regarding their communication experience with the faculty particularly around placements. With escalating issues coming from Paramedics and Social Work we want to address the issues.

JF – Feedback has been received from students about losing data on the cloud and asking about regular access to Marconi

JB – There was an update on the Heron about lost data, are these linked

JF – They are but when IT came to help deal with some of the issues they found that they were unable to recover some data for some students and the only feedback they received was to make more storage space. But students have still lost large pieces of work and whole submissions

FLY – You can refer them to SU advice, if IT are not able to recover their work, we can at least help them apply for exceptional circumstances and get an extension on their submission so they can catch up.

#### 4. 4. Campaign Rep Updates

4.1.

PP – Arranging for a speaker to come in and talk about issues and leaving university as a queer student. The guest speaker has also done work with the alumni office – The 'Seeing myself project'

Also looking to arrange a Coffee evening & Poll survey for stats on who identifies as what to tailor to specific needs, as well as being involved with the AHSS newsletter for more visibility

SM – Working with CUSU on a Lighting campaign to improve the lighting situation in the Cambridge area as students are worried for their safety and there was an incident not too long ago.

RN – Has been planning on holding mental health events but submission deadlines has made it difficult so will schedule time with FLY & JB to arrange.

#### 5. Executive Officer Updates:

#### 5.1 President

It is becoming increasingly apparent that some faculties are not keeping to the Keep Wednesday Afternoon Free commitment so is looking to meet with Roderick to reinstate the commitment.

FLY - It would be good to see if Officers, not including HEMS, could enquire about whether Keep Wednesday Afternoons Free is still being followed within the faculty as we had a few accounts of S&E, AHSS and B&L students unable to attend the Student Summit due to lectures at 2pm, 3pm and 4pm

ACTION - NR, AK & RS to bring up, Keep Wednesday Afternoons Free issues at FPT

PDT – Some issues that students experience lead them to go to a range of different service only to

wait several days before being signposted somewhere else when they could have just gone to their PDT to get an answer or resolution. Looking ahead at Jan welcome having faculties clearly promote the role and what students can go to their PDT for while also developing the PDT hub on canvas which currently does not work

ACTION - All officers to discuss PDT visibility and PDT Hub at FPT

Following from last years' good speech policy we are looking to develop a good speech guide in line with university guidance and code of conduct to promote healthy discussion and debate without room for hate speech.

#### 5.2 VP AHSS

The Cost of Living project works is continuing and some of the areas we are looking at the moment is the Hardship fund in terms of its accessibility, eligibility and funding. Also looking to have CoL added to the website navigation bar as so far articles and progress is not easily accessible or visible on the home page.

2 of the Mental Health podcasts have been filmed and are looking ahead to schedule the next videos. It has been really nice to be involved and having other students a part of the process.

With SSLCs being completed and course reps elected and trained we are getting feedback to help support advanced training in AHSS supporting students to develop essential skills to help them complete their portfolios

#### 5.3 VP B&L

Looking ahead with the faculty to have Business panels as part of entrepreneurship week in Jan

CV building sessions happened as part of the futures festival but will now looking ahead to continue these sessions

The article around UK driving for International students is ready to be published on our website and through the International Office

The SU has decided to screen the World Cup

SJ - Further to Nithin's mention of the World Cup screening, we are fundraising for 2 human rights charities: Human Dignity Trust (LGBTQ+ rights) and Amnesty International (Human Rights)

#### 5.4 VP S&E

The design work has come back for the Student Renter's Guide and barring a few minor amendments it is ready for printing, we will have the digital guide available but will also look to print guides for each campus.

LB - Are these going to be kept in SU spaces or given out to students?

They will be kept in the SU space for students to look at but if they need to take one away with them if they are having issues they can.

All of the pushing and campaigning for the university to revise their accommodation and recruitment tactics is starting to pay off as they have capped their international recruitment for January, emails have gone out to applicants to say that there is no accommodation available at ARU and there are plans ahead to look at how we can further grow developing accommodation while keeping recruitment numbers to capacity.

#### 5.5 VP HEMS

The Online Gaming Tournament will be postponed till next semester

Awareness videos are being picked up in the Broadening your Horizons project and we are looking at 10-15 topic areas

Plagiarism & misconduct – Working with the DoS within HEMS to look at how we can address misconduct in HEMS through providing a module for students to complete to make sure they have all the information and awareness they need

There is also work being done to address companies that offer to sell assignments to students by making students aware that they will be caught and will receive a penalty, so it is best to just do the work their selves.

#### 5.6 VP Healthcare Practice

Feedback and proposals have been given for the prayer space development plan so just awaiting confirmation for proposed changes.

Have met with all HoS except one, and they are on board but have expressed concern at the university being able to fund this. In the meantime, I am working on a placement travel guide (due to be released soon). Practice hub is in process of being improved/accessible to all healthcare students (partnering with ME and Student Opportunity team in HEMS).



#### My campaigns

Mental health support Status: Completed

Context of the Campaign: To provide mental health support to students who are coming back to the on-campus university life and help them settle in. Also support them in dealing with the cost of living crisis and how its affecting their mental health

Aims and Objectives: Collaborate with the wellbeing team in the university with their podcast and include stories about accommodation issues and cost of living issues from students and share the stories to students to let them know that they are not the only one going through this.

#### **Updates and Wins:**

Recorded the first episode of the podcast on the topic 'understanding mental health and wellbeing' and the remaining episodes are to be recorded soon on different mental health topic. The release of the episodes would be by January focusing on the new students also the existing students. In conversations with the wellbeing team about the progress in the podcast

**Context of the Campaign:** Make SU more visible to student.

**Aims and Objectives:** To make SU space and the services provided by the SU more visible to students. To increase the student engagement and get students to use the SU space for more events and other activities conducted by the SU.

**Updates and Wins:** In conversation with the Estates and Facilities to put more sign boards around the university to direct students to the SU space. Went around the campus to put necessary signboards to direct students to the SU and waiting for the design update and the quotation from the estates and facilities team.

Design for the floor stickers are done and waiting for budget approval. The updated signage boards and the floor stickers will be on campus by January refreshers, so the SU would be more visible and accessible.

# Advance training in AHSS

Status: Working on

**Context of the Campaign:** Organize additional workshop or other training sessions for students to improve their skills to support their course.

**Aims and Objectives:** Make it more easier for students to get the necessary skills they need to improve their employability and also make their course easier.

**Updates and Wins:** In talks with the course reps to understand which courses need particular trainings and how students can make use of these trainings to make their course much easier and also improve their employability.

The courses needed more resources with the increasing number of students, talked with the department to provide more resources ( cintiq pens) for students.

Held faculty forum with the course reps to listen to the issues and brought to the attention of the faculty that the cost of living is affecting them as the prices of the materials are going up. This was raised in the FPT meeting and the cost of the materials will be revised to make it more affordable to students .
