

Initiations Policy 2013

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Union Notes:

- 1. Initiations and social events have long been part of club and society membership at Universities. The vast majority of these events are well planned and aimed at creating a strong cohesion between members of the club or society.
- 2. However some clubs and societies engage in activities that could be dangerous and harmful to their members. Anglia Ruskin Students Union does not condone these activities and provides a set of guideline for clubs and societies to ensure that their social activities, undertaken in the name of the University and the Union, are conducted in a responsible and safe manner.

Union Believes:

- In recognising the purpose and objectives of Club and Society Socials and Initiations.
- 2. In reaffirming our commitment to provide a safe and welcoming environment for all.
- 3. Presidents and committee members should be mindful of their duty of care over their club or society membership, ensuring their safety during organised activities
- 4. In promoting responsible behaviour and responsible drinking when undertaking activities in the name of the University and the Union.

Union Resolves:

- 1. To provide guidance on how to organise a safe and responsible social event so that all members feel welcome.
- 2. That all Clubs and societies must adhere to said guidance if they wish to hold Initiations / Socials
- 3. Any Club or Societies found not to be adhering to said guidance could be subject to disciplinary action.
