

## POLICY PROPOSAL

Policy Title:	The introduction of Mature Students Reps	Date Policy Proposed:	20/04/15
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## **Union Notes:**

- 1. Mature students are anyone who starts a course at or after the age of 21.
- 2. 40% of mature students are over 30 and have had work, mortgage or family responsibilities. (ucas.com, 2015)
- 3. At least 6674 students at ARU are classed as mature students and over 4000 of those are over 30 years old.
- 4. The NUS' Never Too Late to Learn study reported that 50% of mature students believe that student societies and clubs' social activities are held at inconvenient times, such as the evenings or weekends which often overlap with students' extra-curricular responsibilities.
- 5. 43% of mature students balance childcare responsibilities, family commitments and a demanding academic workload and the university provide very little information/support regarding this.
- 6. 40% of mature drop-out students cited low levels of social involvement at university for why abandoned their course.
- 7. Mature students are presently underrepresented within the Students' Union's executive officers team, none of this year's team, and the incoming team, are mature students.

## Union Believes:

- 1. The Students' Union does not currently effectively represent the needs of mature students.
- 2. We need more activities/entertainment aimed at the over 30s or that is suitable for all ages.
- 3. Mature students need more support and guidance from someone they can relate to.
- 4. The University and Students' Union need to make mature students feel more included and encourage them to get involved to improve their student experience.

## **Union Resolves:**

- 1. To include a Mature Students Rep role for each campus to the representation structure.
- 2. That these posts can only be filled by current mature students.
