Union Notes:

1. Anglia Ruskin Students' Union has supports 41 clubs across four campuses.

Union Believes:

- 1. Students' Union to allow and encourage the participation of transgender students in sports teams.
- 2. There is no current policy in place which makes transgender students aware whether or not they are allowed to join our sports teams
- 3. Sport is an excellent way to improve fitness and get active and to make friends and boost confidence
- LGBT people are a protected minority by the NUS and should not be discriminated against when it comes to participating in sport, or discriminated against at all for that matter
- 5. Despite much resistance, transpeople have competed successfully in professional sport; this is a crucial step towards trans-equality
- Anglia Ruskin University is known for being a diverse and accepting university and by putting this policy in place it would be deserving of that reputation
- 7. Other universities, such as the University of Derby already have a similar model in place which encourages transgender students to join their sports teams and live an active lifestyle, the same as any other student.

Union Resolves:

- 1. To develop policy to expressively include transgender students in sport with the Students' Union sport teams.
- 2. To provide readily accessible information on transgender participation in sport within the Students' Union.
- 3. To ensure our sports teams actively include transgender students in sport.
- 4. To actively review policy to ensure transgender rights within sport is continuously upheld.
