ARU Green Society Fund

What is the fund?

The ARU Green Society Fund is a source of extra funding for your club or society provided by the ARU Environment Team. To apply for funding you will need to complete a set number of green criteria aimed to encourage smart and responsible behaviours that embeds sustainability into the actions of your club and society. Criteria range from small things such as promoting voting in elections to something as big as holding a green event. The more actions you complete the larger the grant you can apply for; we have £50, £100 and £250 grants available.

This year we are taking the fund in a new direction by focusing on the theme of <u>the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's)</u>. Each of the general criteria is related to at least one of the SDG's.

The fund is limited and applications will be based on a first come first served basis. To start the fund we will put £1 in the pot for every student who fills in the ARU Travel Survey during October 2021.

How to apply

To apply for the Green Fund you will need to choose and complete your desired criteria for the tier funding you would like to apply for, and collect sufficient evidence.

The below table shows how many of each criteria you will need to complete for each tier of funding.

	No. of essential (ARU) criteria	No. of general (SDG's) criteria
Green Fund BRONZE £50	1	2
Green Fund SILVER £100	2	3
Green Fund GOLD £250	3	5

Our criteria are split into 'ARU' and 'SDG's', you will need to pick the appropriate number from each category depending on the tier of funding you are applying for. It is important to note to receive the Green Fund GOLD grant you MUST complete all three of the 'ARU' essential criteria.

Clubs and societies can make up to 2 applications per academic year. For the second application by the same club/society the same criteria can be selected however the evidence **MUST** be different.

All the criteria are available at the end of this handbook in a table with details, links to further help and suggestions for your evidence.

To apply please download and complete an application form from our <u>website</u> and send to <u>environment@aru.ac.uk</u>. The deadline for applications for 2021/2022 is Sunday 29th May 2022.

Terms and Conditions

- The grant money must be used to benefit the society in some way, for example providing equipment or paying towards events. If you are unsure whether the use of your grant money is suitable please contact the ARU environment team at environment@aru.ac.uk or 01245 790577.
- Applications and evidence will be reviewed by the Environment Team, which
 reserves the right to reject applications and has the final say. Feedback will always be
 given explaining the reasons for rejection.
- There is a limited budget available and applications will be on a first come first served basis for first time applicants but first time applicants will have priority over those applying for a secondary fund.
- Deadline for entries for the academic year 2021/22 is Sunday 29th May 2022.
- Clubs and societies will not be able to make more than 2 applications per academic year.
- Funds should not be used for activities which contradict the values of ARU, particularly our commitment to environmental responsibility.
- By submitting photos as evidence to the Green Fund you confirm that these can be used in future publicity and marketing material by the Environment Team.
- We require a group photo of your club/society to process your application.
- If your application is successful we ask for you to provide a testimonial for the Green Fund that we can use for future promotions.
